The Digital Personal Data Protection (DPDP) Act, 2023 marks a significant milestone in India's data, privacy landscape and has far-reaching implications for banks and financial institutions that collect, process, store, and share large volumes of customer data.

With increasing digitization of financial services, institutions must ensure that personal data is handled responsibly, securely, and in compliance with regulatory requirements. Thus, data protection in banking and finance is becoming extremely crucial to maintain customer trust, prevent costly fraud, and comply with strict global laws.
